

NURSES KNOW: HEALTH CARE IS IN CRISIS. A safe staffing law would help fix it.



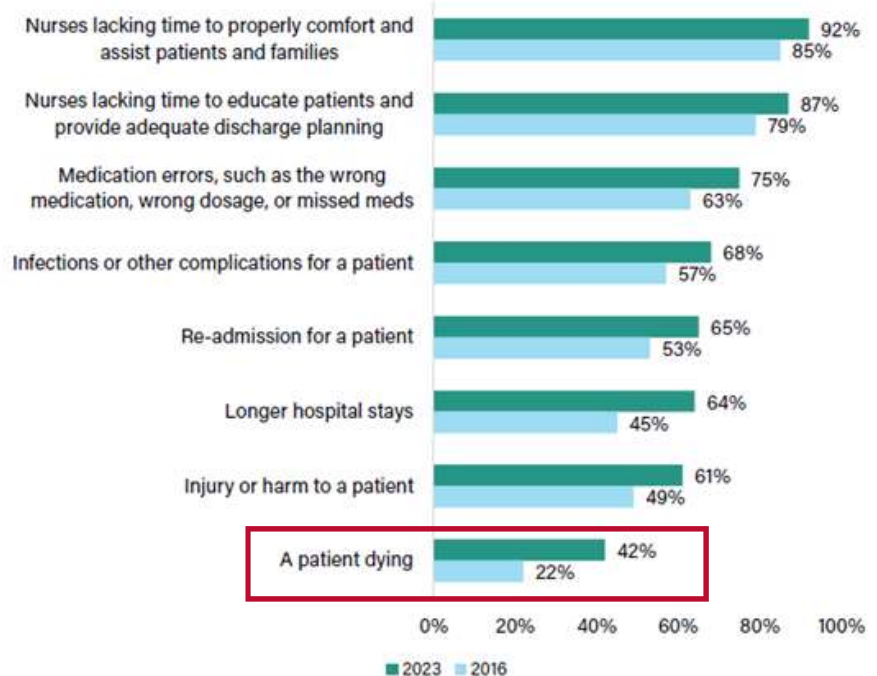
The nurse retention crisis and patient safety crisis go hand in hand. We cannot address one without addressing the other.

53% of Michigan nurses working in direct patient care say they **plan to leave** their current position in the next two years. Currently, **50,000 RNs with active Michigan licenses are not working as nurses.**

79% of Michigan nurses say that **hospital decision making** has led to the crisis rather than a shortage of qualified RNs. Immediate action is needed to stop the downward spiral.

75% of Michigan RNs say they would **be more likely to stay at the bedside** if a safe staffing law were passed.
